Declaring with Pride the Fundamental Values Held by Clinical Mental Health Counselors

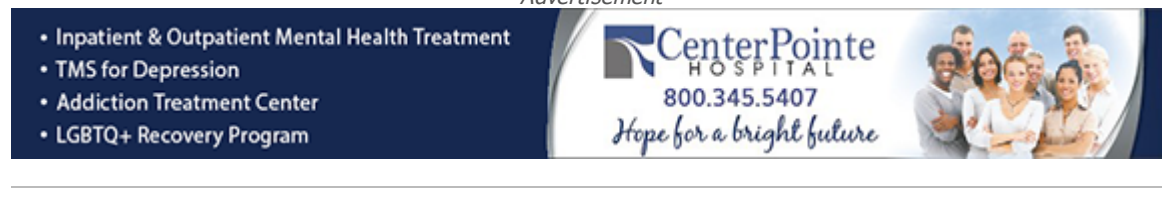

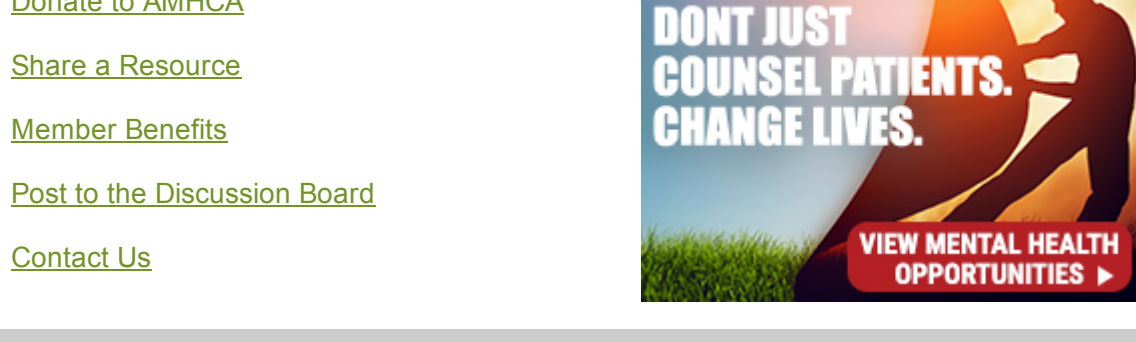
